

A Ripple Effect

Climate scientists have advised of the imminent rise in the Earth's temperature due to global warming. This will have profound and negative consequence for all species and is but one index to the damaging impact that human activities have had on the Earth's systems.

Water – the most fundamental of life-sustaining elements - will continue to be adversely affected.

The artists represented in *A Ripple Effect* seek to address this situation with image-making in the belief that through creative engagement and the finding of collective voice, some greater agency and hope might be possible.

Many manifestations of Water have been explored, surfacing dystopian images of catastrophe and contaminant, but also more optimistically of Water as conductor of sound, revealer of body states and dissolver of fixity through its fundamental character – fluid, and endlessly metamorphosing.

EITZ is a group of artists committed to engaging with the impact of climate change. We believe collective action is fundamental to addressing the scale of this reality.

Mary Anne Botha

Botha investigates differing perspectives on water in her series *Water Planet* and Beautiful Disasters, seeking to explore the dual nature of this resource as an immense and impersonal macro-force, as well as one capable of intimate revelation.

Revealing the nature of water as destructive - as well as replenishing - is attempted in her paintings.



Erica Elk

Elk focuses on cycles of plastic in food chains and water systems and human and other-species ingestion of this waste.

Informed by notions of looming disequilibrium - current estimates predict that by 2050 there will be more plastic in the sea than fish - and the threat posed to all water- dependent life, she uses animation and visual play in her works *The Swimmer* and *Pick up Sticks* as strategies to raise awareness and encourage personal agency.



Katherine Glenday

Glenday considers diverse attitudes and responses to water in the context of the earth's ecological crisis, exploring sound, vibration, movement and wavelength as transmitted through water, the sacred matrix and medium of all life.

Sounding Spheres uses water-holding porcelain vessels to reflect on notions of time, resonance and reverence offered through domesticity and ritual, while the works Endless and Icon's from the *Rivers of Remembering* draw attention to feminine teachers and healers embodying understandings of non-dualistic modes of being and expanded fields of consciousness.



Taryn Millar

Millar focuses on the contaminating chemical footprint threatening human health and marine and riverine life, focusing in particular on areas where untreated waste water is pumped into rivers and coastal areas in South Africa.

Her works *Long After* and *Sketch towards a Disaster At Sea (dialogue with Turner)* draw attention to both a Romantic vision of nature no longer possible due to the overwhelming detritus of contemporary life as well as a dream-like underwater world where survival is attempted by marine life.

In contrast to the sober reflection of this situation, in the work *Home Improvements*, Millar imagines a world where a fantastical compound of machine-creatures and cyborgs cleaning and cooling the oceans offers slender hope.



Josephine Grindrod

Tracy Megan

Against a backdrop of ever-closer and irreversible disruption to the natural systems which sustain life Megan asks what we consider worth preserving. Her series of mixed media work *The Footbrige Was Swept Away, It All Came Flooding Back* present post-apocalyptic possibilities garnered from a public survey of possible survival strategies.

The past is our future, would that I could change it further asks us to consider what we might become capable of in order to survive. Here the gradual collapse of the now-fragile ocean ecosystem is considered through the subtle draining of colour from the multitude of cephalopods which inhabit the work. Imagining a braver future in which we might withdraw from the brink, the restoration of vibrancy occurs through the tentative re-introduction of colour.




