

DEATH AND OTHER ENIGMAS

In this project I explore the transition from life to death, and the notion of an afterlife. It is a journey of self-discovery and my search for personal identity and meaning. It tells a story of the inevitability of death, and the constant daily reminder of my loved one's and my own mortality. It is an inward personal journey of how my history has shaped my views on life, death, and what lies beyond death.

The work tells the story of my funeral which visually takes place now of an event that will play out sometime in the future, using a combination of self portrait photography, artificial intelligence (AI) and chemigrams, a camera less process, to create visual references for life, death, and the unknown realms of what comes after life.

Chemigrams are used to illustrate organic similarity with cellular material. The domains beyond death, are a constant source of intrigue, and angst for me, constantly searching for answers as to why we exist at all, with no clear answers. Through the work, I try to illuminate how I feel about life, death and whatever lies beyond it, inviting viewers to explore the reasons for their own existential journeys.

Dr Edward John (Eddie) Odes is a multifaceted artist and photographer, Born in Johannesburg, he later relocated to Cape Town in 2017, where he embarked on a journey in both academia and the art world. Edward's artistic exploration began with a short introductory course in photography at the ORMS Cape Town School of Photography.





It is an honour to pause, witness and document these beautiful beings who journey through the darkness with me, never letting go.



LESSONSW IN RESILIENCE

In this project, my goal is to capture the lessons and emotions that come with surviving cancer and explore the complexities of the human experience. I believe that photography has the power to heal, connect, and create change. By showcasing the beauty and strength of the human spirit, my intention is to inspire others to embrace their own inner resilience in the face of adversity. Through my work, I hope to provide support and encouragement to those facing their own battles with cancer, including myself.

My mother's breast cancer journey began when she was 38 years old. She underwent chemotherapy treatment, and the cancer was eliminated. However, her battle was not over, as the cancer recurred just one year later. During that difficult time, I asked my mother why she chose not to have a mastectomy to remove her breast. Her response, through a shrug and a look, made me feel like I couldn't fully understand her reasoning. This left me struggling to comprehend why she wouldn't take a step that could potentially save her life.

After her passing, I wondered if societal pressure or the opinions of others influenced her decision. Did she fear that losing a breast would make her feel less feminine or diminish her worth as a woman? These questions haunted me.

In 2013, I personally experienced a cancer diagnosis while living in Kenya, facing endometrial sarcoma. I underwent a hysterectomy surgery and received radiotherapy, which successfully cured my cancer. Then, in 2021, I received another cancer diagnosis, this time with breast cancer. The test results confirmed that it was genetic, something I already knew. However, I refused to let cancer define me or hold me back. With the support of loved ones and healthcare professionals, I embarked on breast cancer treatment. It was a difficult and emotional journey, but I held onto hope and faith, which fortunately led to a cancer-free life, for now.

But perhaps the most mind-blowing lesson that I have learned is the incredible resilience of the human spirit. Even when life throws big challenges at us, we can overcome them with bravery, determination, and the support of others.

My mother's decision not to have a mastectomy stands as a testament to this resilience. She chose to confront her cancer with strength and grace, even in the face of societal pressure and potential judgement. I now understand that her choice did not diminish her womanhood or make her any less of a woman. It was a reflection of her own values and beliefs, and it ultimately led to her victory over cancer

Through my photographs, I aim to honour the journeys of cancer survivors and to inspire others to find their own inner strength. I want to convey that we can face cancer and other challenges with resilience, and that our choices should be respected, free from judgement. By sharing our stories and experiences, we can create a supportive community that uplifts and empowers those navigating the difficult path of cancer.


SUBCONSCIOUS MEMORIES
